The Executive Committee of the New Brunswick Society of Retired Teachers - Saint John Branch (NBSRT – SJ) was saddened to learn of the recent death of our long time Newsletter Editor, Mary Ann Patterson. Mary Ann had been an active member of the Saint John retired teachers' group since her retirement in 2006.

She passed away on December 29, 2022 at the Saint John Regional Hospital with her family at her side. Born in Fredericton, N.B. Mary Ann Gulliver was a natural athlete. She participated in many sports, but eventually Volleyball became her speciality. She and her late husband, David (2006) were well-loved and respected Coaches in the Saint John area and the Province. They were inducted into the Saint John Sports Hall of Fame in 2010 as Builders.

Mary Ann's first teaching assignment was in the fall of 1968 at St. Vincent's Girls High School, where she made life long friends with both students and fellow teachers. She took a few years off to nurture her three children, Dan, Tom and Andrea, then returned to the District as a Physical Education Consultant for many elementary schools helping to set up physical education programs. Her final assignment was at Beaconsfield Middle School.

She wholeheartedly adopted the Middle School philosophy, whether that meant covering the entire gym floor with garbage bags so students could cut up pumpkins as a Halloween activity, or enticing a fellow staff member to use the school rooftop to take a photo of the students, proudly forming the BMS symbol for the newly formed middle school.

She was an excellent teacher who inspired her colleagues, and encouraged her students with her can-do attitude, but first and foremost she was a wonderful mother to her three children, all of whom are active teachers in the N.B. school system.

Our sincere condolences to all of her family, her lifelong friends and her many work colleagues.

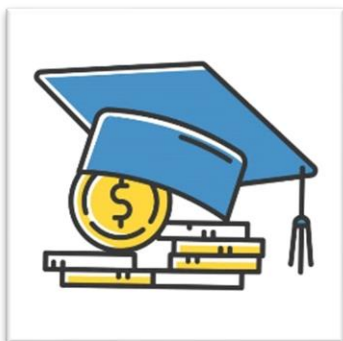
